Dear Parents/Carers,

Firstly, I would like to apologise once more to the parents of children that attend our Nursery, for having to close on Wednesday. We had a COVID outbreak in the staff at FINS, with five staff linked to one class testing positive last weekend. Back filling five roles was impossible, hence in discussion with our Trust we decided we had to prioritise statutory education over non-statutory provision and use the nursey staff in the main school. I do realise that this is very difficult for working parents and I would like to thank you for your understanding and for not filling my email inbox with complaints.

It is a reminder, however, that COVID is still within the community and probably always will be. ## Assessments

We are just about to enter the formal assessment period in school once more. Y6 children have the end of KS2 SATs next week, Y2s will have their tests the following week. In June Y1 and some Y2 will have phonics screening and Y4 will have timetables checks. These are all part of our normal assessment schedule, which all schools complete. Your children have been or are being prepared and supported. I know they will be the best they can be. Please tell them not to worry, reiterate that we are all proud of them and that this is just a time to 'show off' their great learning.
